

OUR LADY OF THE LAKE COLLEGE
STATISTICAL PROFILE
Calendar Year 2013

- **Programs Offered** – Programs available for students admitted for fall enrollment included: 4 master’s degrees, 6 bachelor’s degrees, and 3 associate-level degree programs. Additionally, 1 non-degree/certificate program was offered.
- **Student Enrollment** – Spring 1704 (84% female, 16% male); Summer 821 (83% female, 17% male); Fall 1721 (84% female, 16% male).
- **Credit Hours** – The College generated 42,583 student credit hours in 2013 (18,351 in spring; 5,120 in summer; 19,112 in fall).
- **Program Enrollment** – During the fall semester, 87% of students were enrolled in undergraduate academic degree programs, 10% were in graduate degree programs, and 3% was enrolled in technical programs. Sixty-nine percent of students were enrolled as majors in the School of Nursing; 28% in the School of Arts, Sciences and Health Professions; and 3% in non-degree programs.
- **Age Characteristics** – The average age of students at OLOL College is 27. Seventy-three percent of the student body is under 30 years of age, and 7% is over 40 years of age.
- **Ethnicity Characteristics** – Thirty-one percent of those attending OLOL College self-identify as U.S. Students of Color: 24% Black or African American; 4% Asian; 2% Hispanic; .2% Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander; and 1% American Indian/Alaska Native.
- **Geographic Distribution** – Seventy-four percent of the student body lists their parish of residence as East Baton Rouge (45%) or a parish within a 75-mile radius, primarily Ascension, Livingston, West Baton Rouge or Tangipahoa. Out-of-state student enrollment continues to increase gradually year over year. In the fall of 2013, 57 students (3%) were from states other than Louisiana.
- **Degrees Conferred** – Our Lady of the Lake College awarded 393 academic degrees in 2013. Following the spring semester, 234 degrees were awarded (73% associate; 15% baccalaureate; 12% masters). Completion of the summer term led to 24 additional degree conferrals (79% associate; 21% baccalaureate). Completion of the fall semester led to 135 additional degree conferrals (23% associate; 53% baccalaureate; 24% master’s). Seventy three certificates and diplomas were awarded to students completing non-degree programs throughout the year.
- **Faculty** – The College employs 85 full-time faculty members (both 10-month and 12-month contract), laboratory instructors/coordinators, and draws as needed from a pool of well qualified professionals who serve as adjunct faculty.
- **Staff** – College constituencies are served by 112 professional and support staff members in enrollment services, academic affairs, counseling, financial aid, business affairs, development, institutional effectiveness, library, technology, and administrative support positions including extra duty Baton Rouge police officers and non-work study student workers.
- **Enrollment Trend** – During the Fall 2013 semester, the College experienced a slight decrease in headcount however, we experienced an increase in semester credit hours. The College did not enroll students in the surgical technology, respiratory therapy and practical nursing program during the fall semester. The College has intensified its recruitment and retention efforts to address the decline in headcount. The College partnered with Global Health Initiative to grow enrollment in both the RN to BSN/MSN program and the MHA program. Enrollment in the RN to BSN/MSN was actualized however, enrollment in the MHA program did not occur.
- **Budget** – The College’s operating budget for Fiscal Year 2013 was \$21,767,148. In addition, the College continues to receive the Title III Part A Strengthening Institutions Program Grant of approximately \$400,000 a year for five years starting in October 2011.
- **Physical Plant** – The College occupied eleven buildings near Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center in South Baton Rouge. The College relocated its administrative operations from its Perkins location to its Picardy location (Administration Building and Student Services Building).
