

OUR LADY OF THE LAKE COLLEGE
STATISTICAL PROFILE
Calendar Year 2014

- **Programs Offered** – Programs available for students admitted for fall enrollment included: 4 master’s degrees, 6 bachelor’s degrees, and 4 associate-level degree programs. Additionally, 1 non-degree/certificate program was offered.
- **Student Enrollment** – Spring 1738 (85% female, 15% male); Summer 733 (84% female, 16% male); Fall 1701 (84% female, 16% male).
- **Credit Hours** – The College generated 41,820 student credit hours in 2014 (18,824 in spring; 4,498 in summer; 18,498 in fall).
- **Program Enrollment** – During the fall semester, 89% of students were enrolled in undergraduate academic degree programs, 10% were in graduate degree programs, and 1% was enrolled in technical programs. Seventy-two percent of students were enrolled as majors in the School of Nursing; 27% in the School of Arts, Sciences and Health Professions; and 1% in non-degree programs.
- **Age Characteristics** – The average age of students at OLOL College is 26. Seventy-six percent of the student body is under 30 years of age, and 8% is over 40 years of age.
- **Ethnicity Characteristics** – Twenty-eight percent of those attending OLOL College self-identify as U.S. Students of Color: 20% Black or African American; 3.6% Asian; 4% Hispanic; .2% Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander; and .7% American Indian/Alaska Native.
- **Geographic Distribution** – Seventy-three percent of the student body lists their parish of residence as East Baton Rouge (45%) or a parish within a 75-mile radius, primarily Ascension, Livingston, Tangipahoa or West Jefferson. Out-of-state student enrollment continues to increase gradually year over year. In the fall of 2014, 71 students (4%) were from states other than Louisiana.
- **Degrees Conferred** – Our Lady of the Lake College awarded 354 academic degrees in 2014. Following the spring semester, 187 degrees were awarded (58% associate; 25% baccalaureate; 17% masters). Completion of the summer term led to 25 additional degree conferrals (32% associate; 68% baccalaureate). Completion of the fall semester led to 142 additional degree conferrals (78% baccalaureate; 22% master’s). Eleven certificates and diplomas were awarded to students completing non-degree programs throughout the year.
- **Faculty** – The College employs 81 full-time faculty members (both 10-month and 12-month contract), laboratory instructors/coordinators, and draws as needed from a pool of well qualified professionals who serve as adjunct faculty.
- **Staff** – College constituencies are served by 110 professional and support staff members in enrollment services, academic affairs, counseling, financial aid, business affairs, development, institutional effectiveness, library, technology, and administrative support positions including extra duty Baton Rouge police officers and non-work study student workers. This also includes Deans.
- **Budget** – The College’s operating budget for Fiscal Year 2014 was \$22,741,856. In addition, the College continues to receive the Title III Part A Strengthening Institutions Program Grant of approximately \$400,000 a year for five years starting in October 2011.
- **Physical Plant** – The College occupied twelve buildings near Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center in South Baton Rouge. The College added the Biological Learning and Research Building in August of 2013.
